### **Balm Beach Mediation**

I am writing to you at the direction of the board of directors of The Federation of Tiny Township Shoreline Associations (the "Federation"). The Federation is an umbrella organization representing 27 associations of shoreline residents of Tiny Township. Our member associations, in turn, comprise most owners of privately-held shoreline in the Township.

Along with several of its member associations, the Federation was involved in the beach access mediation conducted by the provincially-appointed mediators, Mr. Paul Torrie and Mr. James McKenzie, which concluded in 2004.

In common with other residents of Tiny Township, we have viewed with deep concern incidents of public disorder at Balm Beach in the last couple of years focusing on a fence constructed by John Marion, a shoreline property owner at Balm Beach.

We understand that, recently, representatives of the Ontario Provincial Police "Major Events Liaison Team" – and possibly also representatives of your office – have been involved in mediation efforts involving Mr. Marion and members of local interest groups known as "PUBB" ("Public Use of Balm Beach") and Save the Beaches ("STB")

While the Federation is in favour of good faith efforts to reduce the tensions and peacefully resolve the issues which have disturbed the community relating to this matter, we point out that any mediated resolution arrived at between Mr. Marion

and any local interest groups, such as “PUBB” and “STB”, has the potential of raising a public expectation that an equivalent result should apply in other situations affecting totally unrelated parties and properties. As such we suggest that there is a broader public interest in the current mediation process that should be taken into consideration.

Accordingly, except to the extent that any such mediation addresses only issues entirely personal to Mr. Marion, we would urge you to take proper steps to ensure the input and involvement of other stakeholders in the community, including the Federation, which represents the largest number of stakeholders with a direct interest in the issue, before proceeding further with any mediated settlement relevant to general beach access issues at Balm Beach.

We ask to be kept informed of all communications in relation to this matter and would appreciate your consideration of our concerns.
