Gypsy Moth Update

Date: October 4, 2019

(Tiny, Ontario) An increase in European Gypsy Moth feeding within the County of Simcoe has been observed in 2019. Partial defoliation of trees have been noted within parts of some member municipalities, including the Township of Tiny.

The Township of Tiny will not be performing a Spray Program on Municipally-owned property. Residents must ensure that they are following the proper protocol should they choose to spray, and must also respect the wishes and desires of the neighbouring property owners.
